The fourth Postgraduate Symposium on ***Linguacultural Spaces: Inclusion, Extension and Identification in Discourse and Society*** builds on previous collaboration between academics at **CeSLiC (Centre for Linguistic and Cultural Studies)** at the Department of Modern Languages of the University of Bologna (LILEC), the **School of Critical Studies** and the **School of Modern Languages and Cultures** at the University of Glasgow, and the Department of Culture Studies/ School of Humanities and Digital Sciences at the University of Tilburg. The current symposium is an opportunity to enhance the **collaborative ethos** between the four institutions, each of which has an active research culture in the sociolinguistics of diversity and inclusion.

The symposium **invites postgraduate students at each institution to share their knowledge and to learn from and mutually support each other** in a collaborative research project that is itself an ongoing process of diversity and inclusion. We welcome abstract contributions from PhD students (**200-300 words** plus bibliographic references), at any stage of their research, about **any topics related to inclusion, extension, and identification, broadly understood, with a focus on languages and cultures.** (*For reference, please see last year's [programme and speakers.](#)*)

Three or four abstracts will be selected from each institution, and each talk will be assigned a time slot of **15 minutes**, followed by discussion.
