

#### 10:00-10:10 Institutional greetings



Professor **Angelo Paletta** is Director, Department of Management, Alma Mater Studiorum, Università di Bologna. teaches and researches on Internal controls, Cost Management; Corporate performance measurement, Corporate bankruptcy and turnaround, Public Management, Educational Leadership, Governance and accountability of Universities; Circular economy and business models. He is currently coordinator of the European Horizon 2020 project "Developing and Implementing Sustainability-Based Solutions for Bio-Based Plastic Production and Use to Preserve Land and Sea Environmental Quality in Europe



Professor **Cristina de Maria** (Rector's Delegate for Equity Diversity and Inclusion, Alma Mater Studiorum-Università di Bologna. I graduated in Drama, Art and Music Studies at the University of Bologna in 1992, and I have obtained a PhD in Semiotics in 1996 at the same University. Since my PhD thesis, my research interests focus on gender and cultural studies in their overlaps with a semiotic perspective on cultural dynamics, along with their formations, articulations and interpretations. Nowadays, my research interests are still centered on feminist theories and the representations of gendered identities in the media. I have been working also for many years on cultural memory, post-conflict memories and the genres of testimony, and on the spaces and places of commemoration.

Daniela Bolzani is Associate Professor, Department of Management, Alma Mater Studiorum, Università di Bologna and MIG.EN.CUBE principal investigator. After 5 years of work in the domain of financial audit and of development cooperation in Europe and Africa, Daniela obtained a Ph.D. in Business Management (2013). She was a postdoctoral fellow at the Departments of Business and Educational Sciences of UNIBO (2013-2017), a Junior Assistant Professor in Management at the Università Cattolica in Milan (2017-2020) and at the University of Bologna (2020-2023). She is currently an Associate Professor in Management at the University of Bologna. She was a visiting scholar at Leeds School of Business, University of Colorado (2013) and HEC Paris (2016); and visiting professor at JUNIA-ISA (2022 and 2023). Her research concerns entrepreneurial decision-making with a focus on diversity (e.g., culture, gender) and social inclusion. Her research has been published in international journals such as the Journal of Business Venturing, Strategic Entrepreneurship Journal, Small Economics, International Business Journal Management Reviews, Entrepreneurship and Regional Development, Journal of Technology Transfer. She coordinates and is a member of numerous European and national projects on these issues and has been a consultant for the OECD and UN-IOM.

From 2014 to 2016 she has been the Coordinator of the International PhD in Management at the University of Bologna. From November 2015 to October 2021 she has been Vice Rector for Entrepreneurship and Relations with Companies at the University of Bologna.

**David Halabisky** is a project co-ordinator in the OECD Centre for Entrepreneurship, SMEs, Regions and Cities. He is currently working on several projects related to entrepreneurship policy, including a multi-year project on inclusive entrepreneurship and is the main author of the Missing Entrepreneurs reports. Prior to joining the OECD in 2011, David worked for more than a decade in the Canadian Public Service where he worked on SME policy at the Federal Ministries of Industry, Finance and Labour. Mr. Halabisky has won several awards during his career, including a Best Paper Prize from the Administrative Sciences Association of Canada. He has degrees in economics from the University of British Columbia and McMaster University.

Professor Monder Ram OBE is the Director of the Centre for Research in Ethnic Minority Entrepreneurship (CREME) at Aston University. One of the foremost international scholars researching ethnic minority entrepreneurship, Prof Monder Ram's work has helped to shape the field over the past 3 decades. From his considerable research output to the founding of the Centre for Research in Ethnic Minority Entrepreneurship, Prof Ram has become established as a leading scholar and impactful researcher. His commitment to engaged scholarship has resulted in several social science inspired initiatives that have benefited diverse and overlooked communities. His research outputs are complemented by a lengthy record of external research funding awards from prestigious sources such as ESRC, NERC and Low Pay Commission as well as from national and regional public bodies. Prof. Ram has held visiting Professorships at Lund University and Turku University in Finland. He serves as an advisor to the All Party Parliamentary Group for BAME Business Owners and is a member of the Ethnic Minority Business Group at the Department for Business, Energy, and Industrial Strategy (BEIS).
